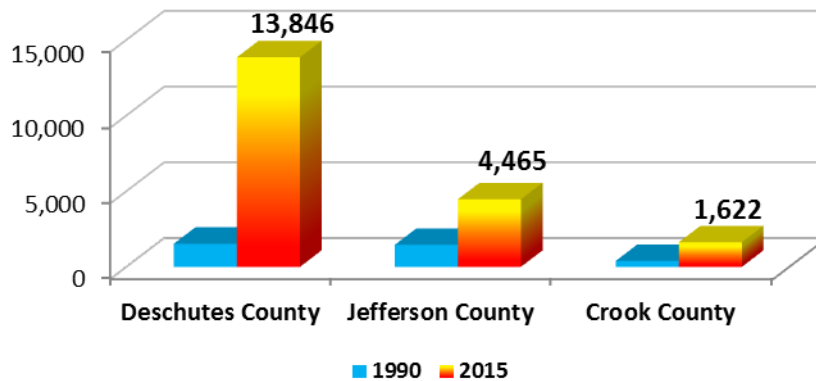

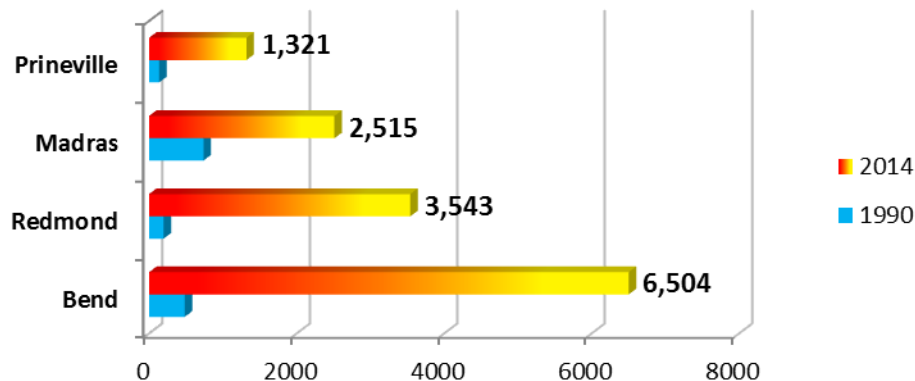

**New Jobs created and filled in 2004**

81% of foreign-born Latinos filled jobs requiring minimal education  
 76% of native-born Latinos filled jobs requiring minimal education  
 64% of new jobs filled by white workers *required* a college education

In 2004, newly arrived Latinos added 955,000 workers to the labor force (1/3 of total)
